Burnish - apply heavily




Chartrense Grass Green Dark Green

then blend with paintbrush




Result without Burnishing Coloring Process of Water Droplet


Apply White & Chartreuse on light areas




Grass Green on shadows Outline with Dark Green






Outline shadows with Black White Burnish on reflection

Burnish with Chartreuse Outline with 0.3 Black Ink Pen White Ink on Lightest Reflection





Coloring Stages

Stage 1

Tackle one area at a time
Lightest Area then
Medium tones and Dark.
It is difficult to lighten an
artwork when using
colored pencils.



Tip: Apply layers lightly and in circular motion.

Stage 2

Adjust color values, this is when you decide whether to go dark or darker by applying multiple layers. It is the secret to vibrant artwork. Burnishing is done LAST...



Trivia: Use what works for you, I used an eye shadow brush

Stage 3

Another secret is OUTLINE
this achieves dimension to
a more realistic results.
THIN Outline = Great!
THICK Outline = Overdone
Pay attention to where
the shadows are,
that is where you apply
the outline

Stage 4

Repeat previous process until all areas are covered. For background, a contrast color helps the subject to pop out. Emphasize darkest and lightest areas, this improves the vibrancy of the image.



Finishing

Outline the shadows of the droplets, and use a white ink to create that water reflection.

Tip:

For newbies, choose a favorite subject, zoomed and with bare background, this helps you focus on the subject and the details.

Mediums Used:

Prismacolor Premier, Faber Castell Coloring Fibre Tip Pens, Dong-A Hexaplus Fineliner 0.4mm, Eye-Shadow Brush, Rotring Isograph Pen 0.6mm, Pilot G-Tech Black Ink Pen 0.3mm
